The above and foregoing writing purporting to be the last will and testament
of Sally Green deceased was presented in Court by Robert Green the person
above named as Executor who sworn to said will in the presence of the
law and the same was duly proved by the oath of Charles Sebastian and Thomas
Green two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered by the Court to be
recorded.

Whereas it was by the power that I, Charles Sebastian of the County of Buchanan
and State of Kentucky do make and amend and alter this my last will and testament in the manner
following hereby looking at others by me heretofore made. It is my will and desire that a
my just debt be paid out of my personal property and at my death that is much of my personal
estate as will be required to pay off such debts as I shall be liable for by my last will and testament
and my debts. It is my will and desire that the residue of my estate be divided equally among
the children of my wife as above named be right to settle in the possession of my wife and under
the direction of my Executor for the purpose of raising and educating my children (which I wish
thoroughly educated) until the marriage of my wife if that should happen or until my children
Mary or Anne at the age of twenty one years and when any of them should so happen
it is my will that my estate be divided equally among the children of my wife as above named
and my debts. It is my will that in case my wife should marry that she have choice of a tract of land and two
hundred and fifty acres of my estate during her lifetime and at her death the whole be taken back to my Executor
for distribution. It is my will that my children shall be educated and after they have a good
English education out of my estate on a good distribution all my property both real and
personal be divided equally among my legal heirs and share alike to each of my children.
It is my will that each of my children and single shall at the time of their marriage or when they
arrive at the age of 21 years have out of my estate such presents as I have given to them in their
lifetime when they were married say a Ring a Horse & Chaise & Buggy &c. It is my will that any
two of my executors have power & shall have full authority to sell any or all of my lands and
convey the same legally as I could have done during my lifetime and if any of my executors should
become incompetent or unprofitable to the estate it is my will that my Executor or any of them
in the same manner speak of in relation of the lands and that my executors have full power
to execute Wills of Sale for the same and that the proceeds of such Sale shall be considered as
profits in the hands of my executors and put to a discrete sale and then a general distribution
thereof to be made. It is my will & nomination that my wife Prudence & Son & Son-in-law Henry Green
& Samuel Shensley be appointed my Executors to carry into effect the provisions of this my
last will & testament and if they should die, if any or fail to qualify it is my will that

Arthur Board put the place made vacant by the death or nonresidence of the person named as executor. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my seal this 11th day of December A.D. 1825.

In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Board of the County of Buchanan and State of Kentucky being in perfect health of body and of sound and disposing mind and memory considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and to provide for the better preparation to leave this world when I shall please God to call me home as then on death this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say to my daughter Elizabeth I leave my negro woman Susan and her two children namely Rachel and Elizabeth and their increase for ever I also leave to my negro woman Doughty her choice of one cow & sheep & her provisions also my cap & cane and provisions belonging thereto also my horse they also I give to my negro woman Doughty in company of her sons and faithful services with me the balance of my estate real and personal in the equal division between my children to wit my three named Elizabeth Board, Joseph Board, Richard Board, Thomas Board Jr. and the heirs of William Board to wit and John Board they being my lawful heirs I nominate and appoint Joseph Board, Thomas Board Jr. and John Board my executors and put my signature hereunto this present day and cause attested with real and personal and in case either of them will not act the other two or some of them may act and see that this my last will and testament be fully executed and done according to the true intent and meaning of the of the foregoing. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of December A.D. 1825 and the said witnesses to wit Joseph Board, Richard Board, Thomas Board Jr. and John Board.
