Item 1st It is my will and desire that after my death that my body be decently buried—

Item 2nd It is my will and desire that my funeral expenses and just debts be paid—

Item 3rd I will and bequeath after the payment of funeral expenses and debts to my dearly beloved wife Mary Ann Beavin all of my real and personal estate during her widowhood, and it is my will and desire that my wife shall sell privately whatever property may be necessary for the purpose of paying the debts that my estate may be owing— and in case of my wifes ^{then} marriage again it is my will and desire that whatever property may then be in her hands shall be divided as though I had made no will at all— between her and my children—

Item 4th I hereby nominate and appoint my dearly beloved wife Mary A. Beavin Executrix of this my last will & testament requesting the Court to let my ^{my} said Executrix qualify and give bond without requiring her— give security as I am not conscious of owing much— as witness my hand this 4th day of Janry 1856

Examined I Nicholas Laycomb of Breckenridge City & State of Ky being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make this my last will and testament

1st I will that my body be buried in a decent manner & I will my soul to God who gave it

2^d I will that all of my just debts be paid out of my estate

3^d I will that each of my children have one hundred and twenty five dollars out of my estate except Louisa Griffee (she having already received that amount & also except Nancy Bryant I will that she shall have seventy five dollars she having also received fifty dollars I will

that my son James Hayscomb shall receive the one hundred and twenty five dollars which I design for him out of my present crop of Tobacco or out of my pork this fall I will the rest of my children receive their portion to wit the one hundred and and twenty five dollars when they shall become of lawful age or get married I will all the balance of my estate to my beloved wife during her life time and at her death to be equally divided among all of my children or their heirs I request that my wife and my son James Hayscomb be the executors of this my last will & testament done this twenty second day of May 1856

- 4th I desire my Daughter Mary Turpin have one dollar over and above what she has already had

- 6th I desire the unknown heirs of my daughter Ann Ausburn have one dollar out of my Estate
- 7th I desire my son Richard Powers have one dollar over and above what he has had
- 8th I desire my son David Powers have one dollar over and above what he has had
- 9th I desire my son John H. Powers have one dollar over and above what he has had
- 10th and lastly I desire after my just debts are paid that Nancy Amman my sister and William Amman to have the balance of my property this I bequeath and give to them for their kindness to me.

I hereby appoint William Amman my Executor to this my will and I Request the court not to require security of him as I am not much in debt. Sales require my property shall not be appraised this 23^d January 1856
