 1st After my death all my just debts and funeral expenses are to be paid by first by my Executors
 2nd I have heretofore given to my children by my first and second marriages the following amounts to wit To Jesse J. Henderson One thousand Dollars, to Susan E. Jolly wife of Geo. W. Jolly, One thousand Dollars, To T. B. Henderson One thousand Dollars, To P. R. Henderson One thousand Dollars, To Mary Belle Stith wife of Wm. Stith Twelve Hundred Dollars, To Annie E. Foote wife of Ed. Foote Five hundred Dollars of my estate and I desire that they take nothing more of my estate until my other children by my last marriage are made equal to them except Annie E. Foote who has ^{not} received as much as the others.

3rd I give and bequeath to the said Annie E. Foote the sum of Five hundred Dollars (\$500⁰⁰) to make her equal to those who have heretofore received as aforesaid

4th I give and bequeath to Ernest Henderson, Nellie Henderson, Nora Henderson and Richard E. Henderson children by my last marriage the sum of Seven hundred Dollars (\$700⁰⁰) each, to make them equal to my other children which sums are to be paid to each of them as they each become of age. And in addition thereto a sufficient sum is to be set aside for their education which sums are not to be charged to them or paid until they are of age. The aforesaid devise of Seven hundred Dollars each to the children of my last marriage does not make them equal to what has been paid to my children by former marriages but this inequality is from the fact that I need by their mother's property when we married

5th If sufficient means shall not be on hand at the time of my death or cannot be derived from the sale of my personal property I desire that enough land shall be sold to pay my just debts and bequests herein before expressed. The above mentioned bequest of Seven hundred Dollars each to my three younger children Nellie, Nora, and Richard, each be arranged for in the same manner when they severally become of age

6th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Hannah E. Henderson one third (1/3) in value of my estate and I desire that she and my children by her shall live upon and occupy the farm and house which is now our home until a final settlement and distribution of my estate is made

5th I desire that a final Settlement of my estate I shall be made when my ~~oldest~~ youngest son Richard E. Henderson shall have arrived at the age of Eighteen years (18) and that the remainder of my estate after the foregoing bequests have been satisfied shall be divided equally among all my children but if my wife should marry or die a settlement can be ~~divided~~ ~~equally~~ ~~among~~ ~~my~~ ~~children~~ ~~but~~ ~~if~~ made at any time my executor may deem advisable

6th I hereby constitute and appoint my son R. E. Henderson and my wife Harriet E. Henderson Executors of my estate and I request that no bond be required of them. In the event of the death of my wife I hereby constitute and appoint said R. E. Henderson my sole Executor
