Lewis C. B. B. each a share as follows when it is convenient for her
to do so and after her death I Will and bequeath fifty dollars
to each of my children Smith Nancy J. B. B. James H. Globock
Mary C. Ramsey Martha C. Ball William S. Globock Susan T.
C. B. B. Annilda M. Denison John S. Globock and Annilda M.
Globock and the residue of my property to be divided equally
between the above named heirs and Martha M. B. B. and Lewis
C. B. B. I hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary S. Globock Sole
executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
former Wills by me made
