nominate constitute and appoint my son Andrew Birmingham
Joseph Birmingham and William Lee my executors and do
hereby all other wills do make and my last will and Testa-
ment do hereby whereby I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this Twenty sixth day of March Eighteen hundred and Eight

being sound in mind and memory but coming to an accident
am in a low state of health do make this my last will and Testament
First of all my soul to the mercy of God I commit my body to be
interred at the discretion of my executor. I After paying my
funeral expenses and just debts it is my will and desire
that my will beloved wife Peggy Perkins do have all that I may
be possessed of in the State of Kentucky to dispose of as she may
think proper I do hold deeds for about twelve thousand acres of land
lying in the State of Pennsylvania for which I employed Jonas
Clarkson living in the town of Hancock Delaware County State of
New York to sell for me it is my wish that if the said land is not
sold that my brother Joseph Perkins be empowered to sell said lands
and after him being paid for his trouble it is my desire that all
profits arising from said lands be equally divided between my brother
Joseph and my three sisters after paying to Samuel Williams debt of
about one hundred dollars that I owe him but if my wife should be
pregnant and I should have a legal heir it is my will and
desire that she live should have all the profits of the sale of said
land & all that I may be entitled to from my Father's estate

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and from the estate of my aunt that I leave to my wife if I have no
 heir If I have an heir it is my desire that it shall have all that may
 be entitled to from my Father and Aunt I do nominate constitute and
 appoint Thomas Kinchloe my Executor in the State of Kentucky and
 my brother Joseph Perkins to settle all my business in the Eastern
 States and receiving all other will do make this my last will and
 Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal
