I William Watcher of Rockbridge County and State of Kentucky having the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make this my last Will and Testament as follows, to wit. Should my wife and partner in life Mrs. Susan Watcher survive me I do wish that she shall have of my Estate as her absolute property two Negro Girls named Mary a servant named named child her daughter Sarah and all the rest of the Estate which I may be possessed of at the time of my death this division is made not only from the my own feelings for her but as an act of justice to her for services which I owe not here enumerated. I do wish that my wife & family continue after my death to be happy & secure to my said wife all the rest and residue of my Estate both real and personal for and during her life or as long as she shall live to keep my family together and educate and raise my children which I do expect this will is to be considered as an absolute agreement on her part without any change to my children or either of them so that when they arrive at full age they may not be encumbered with debts for schooling boarding or any thing furnished them by their Mother. I hereby appoint my wife whole and sole Guardian of my children during her lifetime, but should she marry it is my wish that her former husband of my children and over their property even so although I have every confidence in my wife during my childrens justice so long as she should have a right to act for herself yet so soon as she should have a husband to control her I wish her power over my children and their property to cease and at the death or marriage of my wife it is my Will and desire that all my estate both real & personal not devised to my wife absolutely shall be equally divided amongst all my children. I appoint my wife Mrs. Susan Watcher my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and request her to pay off all my just debts and to enable her to do so I do not desire her to take any property I may be possessed of either to pay debts or the support of herself and family. I hereby declare this to be my last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have set my hand and seal this 12 day of August 1836.
