

In the name of that loved I John Shorman of Buchanan's County Kentucky being of sound mind and memory but weak in body and believing it is appointed unto man once to die do make and give this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made 1st I give unto my beloved wife Catherine Shorman one hundred dollars in cash and thirty six dollars in notes for the express purpose of paying for the land which I intend buying and being in Perry County Indiana a State adjoining Adam Shorman's tract also I give her the above tract of land and one cow and calf two sows and pigs one hen and lamb one feather bed and furniture as much furniture as she please take together with a pair of curtains and bedstead all the kitchen furniture and all the cupboard furniture a pair of fine dogs an iron pot rack and half dozen chairs a large chest a table a floor stool a looking glass a large table and such other books as she can read and all the species of household furniture as she may wish to take excepting two beds furniture and bedsteads also all the corn and meat and the place where I now live laid off for consumption. 2nd I will that the land where I now live be sold after my death together with all the farming valuable stock of horses balance of stock of every kind and may as well as that she have the one third of the purchase money after all just debts are paid funeral expenses paid &c. I will the remaining two thirds be equally divided between Adam Shorman John Shorman and Stephen Shorman my three sons 3rd I do appoint my beloved wife Catherine Adam Shorman and Stephen Shorman my executors to this my last will and my will is that my wife be qualified without security I witness my hand of I Shorman at my hand and affix my seal this 18th day of April 1818
