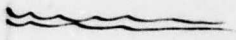

Witnesses thereto, and adjudged by the Court to be the true last
will and Testament of the Jacob Mork deceased and
ordered to be recorded

I, Robert McGarock of the County of Breckinridge & State
of Kentucky, being in good health, both calling to mind the
uncertainty of this life & willing to dispose of what remain of
my worldly Estate, do make & publish this my last will, as follows
Item 1st, I give & devise to my Son Randal H. McGarock & his
assigns forever 200 Acres of Land, lying on Honey Locust Creek in the
County of Hancock, being the same on which he now resides, to be
laid off, so as to include his improvement, this is done to make his
portion equal with his brothers, all of whom except Francis F. the youngest
son, have received 200 Acres of Land or its equivalent in Money
Item 2, I give & devise to my Son Francis F. McGarock (at the death
of myself & wife & his assigns forever 200 Acres of Land lying on Honey
Locust Creek, in the County of Breckinridge State of Kentucky, to be
laid off, so as to include the Homestead & all valuable improvements
200 Acres of which is devised to him to make his portion equal with
his brother & 100 Acres is given him to compensate him in part for
providing for Son Thomas orphan children & giving them a home
in his family until they marry. I bequeath him also all the
Stock on the Farm (the Hides, the Work Ox & one Saddle Mare & gelding)
also all the farming utensils & one half the Household & Kitchen
Furniture, & the residue of my Estate I reserve for the use of
myself & wife during our natural lives & at our death, to
be equally divided amongst all of our children, to wit, Randal
H. McGarock, Jacob McGarock, Thomas H. McGarock, John B. McGarock,
James H. McGarock, Gordon C. McGarock, John B. McGarock
& Francis F. McGarock, lastly I nominate & appoint my Sons —
Randal H. John B. & Francis F. McGarock Executors of this my Will.
hereby annulling & revoking all other Wills, by me heretofore made or
published, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
& Seal this 3^d day of March in the Year 1860

Whereas I Robert McGarock late of the County of Boeckwinge
 State of Kentucky now of the County of Howard State of Missouri
 have by my last Will & Testament in writing duly executed bearing
 date the 8 day of March in the Year 1866. having in the 3^d and
 last Item of said Will reserved the residue of my Estate for the
 use of myself & wife during our natural lives & at our deaths to
 be Equally divided among all of our Children which Estate consists
 of Lands, Rents, Notes & a few articles of House hold furniture, lying
 in the County of Boeckwinge State of Kentucky - now I the said
 Robert McGarock, do make this Codicil, to my said Will & I do hereby
 revoke the said Legacies by my said Will given to be divided among
 all my Children & I do give the same at our death to my Sons
 Robert B. McGarock, James H. McGarock & Gordon C. McGarock
 as compensation to them for providing for us & our Grand Daughter
 Annie McGarock until the death of myself & wife, to be shared in
 proportion to the amount contributed by each and I do satisfy &
 Confirm my said Will in every thing except where the same is hereby
 revoked & altered as aforesaid. I do appoint as Executors of my
 Will my three Sons Robert, James & Gordon C. McGarock, also I auth-
 orize my Executor after my decease to bargain, sell, alien &
 convey all those my Lands Situate as aforesaid in the County of
 Boeckwinge State of Kentucky, in such manner & on such terms
 as to them may seem expedient best. If not sold before my death

 deceased and ordered to be recorded. The Codicil altho admitted
 to Record, was not proven in Court

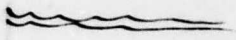
