I Rosina Holt being of sound mind and disposing memory do make this my last will and testament and act and declaration of division as herein after set forth more explained. I give and bequeath unto my two grand children Mary Holt and Rosa Holt daughters of my son W D Holt one thousand dollars each to held in trust for them by my executor hereinafter appointed until they become of age or marry. If either of my aforesaid grandchildren should die before attaining majority I desire her bequest to be paid to the surviving one subject to the provision as above. If both of my aforesaid grandchildren should die before attaining their majority or marrying, I bequeath to my son W D Holt both shares of this aforesaid bequest, viz: two thousand dollars. I give to each of my aforesaid grandchildren Mary and Rosa a mare colt provided I should own two such colts at my death I give to my two aforesaid granddaughters all my silver ware of every kind to be held in trust for them by my executor under the same provision as the first bequest herein. I give and bequeath unto my son W D Holt all my money stocks bonds notes and choses in action of which I may be possessed and not otherwise disposed of in this will directing him to give his wife Vanda if she survives me the sum of five hundred dollars. I give to my son W D Holt all my live stock of whatever kind or nature. I give to my said son W D Holt all my household and kitchen furniture. And whereas by the last will and testament of my beloved husband Thomas Holt it is declared that his estate meaning his real property in which by said last will and testament he devised to me a life interest

454 shall at my death go to his two chil-
dren Richard W D Holt or their heirs
and that the said estate shall be by
me divided between said children
as I may think best, now therefore
pursuant and in the execution of the
power and authority therein given me
I have made said division and
declare it to be as follows. All that part
of said real estate belonging to my
said husband lying between a line
running from the house where Thomas
Pearce now lives (including said
house and yard thereto belonging) to the
lower line of the tract of land on
which Mrs Minor now lives and the
Ohio river is under said division
hereby allotted to the said W D Holt
the line above mentioned from Pearce
house to Mrs Minor's line is to run
parallel with the public road from
Stephensport to Cloverport as it now
runs through the tract of land thus
divided, and the part of the tract
thus allotted to W D Holt embraces the
dwelling and out houses garden and
the old home place and all land
included in the original deed from
Richard Stephens except what lies
eastwardly of the said line from
Pearce's house to Mrs Minor's line
there is also allotted under this di-
vision to said W D Holt sixteen acres
of timbered land next to and south
of what is now known as the new
ground and bounded as follows
to wit: on the east by land of Mrs
Amanda Minor to the south by land
of J. J. Jones and on the west by land
of J. J. Stephens, all the rest of the real
estate of my said husband not
herein before allotted is under the
division now made hereby allotted
to the said John R Holt it consists
it is believed of about two hundred
acres while the land thus allotted to
the said John R Holt does not equal
in its improved value the land al-
lotted to W D Holt yet when added
to the large and numerous advances

45-5- in money made by my said husband
in his lifetime to the said John R. Holt
he and have received from said
husband and his estate a larger
amount than that received by W. D.
Holt. My said husband was aware
that I had personal knowledge of
these advances intended in the
discretion, with which by invested
you in the devise of the estate that
I should take them into consider-
ation. In this I cannot be mistaken
and hence in the division now made
and declared I have sought to carry
his wish and purpose into effect.
I hereby appoint my son W. D. Holt
executor of this my last will and
testament and I request the court
not to require any bond of him
as executor or trustee. In testimony
