In the Name of God amen I Sally Gypscock of the County of Buckner and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory but knowing the uncertainty of life do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following To Wit. First I give my Soul to God who gave it my body to be buried to be decently buried by the Side of my beloved husband. Then the first after paying all my just debts I give all my Estate Real and personal to be equally divided between my Son John H. Shady and my daughter Henry Gypscock and to my Black Woman Lily the property I have hitherto given them to remain as now agreed to the division they have already made. My Black Woman Lily is not to be divided or sold but to live with John H. Shady and he shall support her as long as she lives and lastly I leave my Son John H. Shady my Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal this 5th day of May 1838
