In the name of God amen the fourteenth day of September 1816 I Stephen Hall of the County of Buchanan and State of Kentucky being very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God strep calling unto mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament (what is to say) I give and bequeath to Patsy Hall my dearly beloved wife all and singular my lands negroes and tenements with every other species of personal and real estate by her to be possessed and enjoyed And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments with legacies bequests &c by in any ways before named made and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year above written

In the first I commit my body to the earth to be decently buried and soul to God that gave it I will that all my just debts be paid I will that all my personal estate together with all bank notes and book accounts be left to the management of my dear wife Polly for the purpose of raising my children and after her decease or death for self divide the balance equally amongst my four children as they come <sup>into</sup> ~~from~~ my land I will my wife the benefit of as long as she

In the name of God amen I Elizabeth Harlin of Buckingham County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of a sound disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time when I constitute this my last Will and Testament and it is my desire after my death my body to be decently interred and my just debts and funeral charges paid by my Executors hereafter mentioned I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Harlin one third of my whole estate so long as she lives and then to turn to my children the other two thirds to be equally divided between my beloved children that is to say Eliza Harlin Sarah Harlin George Harlin Ellen Harlin Harlan and Mary Harlin I constitute make and assign Richard Lusk of Hardin County and William Love of Grayson County the sole Executors of this my last will and Testament and do hereby revoke and utterly disannul and disannull all and every other former will and Testament whosoever and confirm this to be my last will and Testament in witness hereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this third day of July One thousand eight hundred and seventeen (intended before signed)
