Having full confidence in her ability to manage the estate during her widowhood or natural life. Then I will that so much of my personal property be sold or as much as can be taken not to inter-
 fere with her earnings on the farm, if she wishes to do so.

Third if either tract of land should have to be sold, I will and de-
 sire that the tract known as the Whitworth tract be sold. Fifth if my wife Elizabeth May should marry then the law will take the estate and divide it equally between all my children, ~~except two~~
 two daughters except Rosina May and Nancy Jane Roberts my
 two daughters they are to have two hundred dollars more out of
 my estate after the death of my beloved wife. the balance to be
 equally divided between the boys to wit, Wm May Alexander
 H. May and Richard May and the heirs of Samuel May Jr. and 2
 girls Rosina May and Nancy J. Roberts all to share equally af-
 ter the \$100 cash to the two daughters. I hereby appoint my wife Eliza-
 beth May and Morris Eskridge as Executors and Executrix of this my
 last will and testament. and surking all other wills heretofore
