Bennett of the County of Breckenridge and State of Kentucky, in view of approaching death do in these presents proceed to make the following disposition of my property first I desire that all my just debts be paid out of my estate I also will and bequeath to my wife Lucinda Bennett all the remaining portion of my estate both personal and real to have and to hold and manage as she may see most conducive to interest of herself and children this I will to stand for life term or during her widowhood and after death I desire that all my children shall inherit an equal share in my remaining property lastly I do hereby appoint my wife Lucinda Bennett executrix of this my last will and testament wishing that the Court require no homestead of her now in witness of this being my last will and testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day 1854

Know all men by these presents that I Sarah Rollins of Breckenridge County Ky do this the 4th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four make this my last will and testament in the presence of three Witnesses Whereas I will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Rollins one bed and bed clothing & one cow I will and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Rollins one cow one bed & furniture for the house I will and bequeath to my son Amos Rollins all the stock that he claims to wit one Horse two Calves one sow and pigs and seven sheep and one bed and furniture to the same I will and bequeath to my son David C. Paulins all the stock that he claims to wit one colt one yearling calf two sheeps and one bed and bedding I will and bequeath to my daughter Mary F. Paulins one bed and bedding It is my will that all my property that this will does not contain shall be sold and after all my debts is paid my daughter Elizabeth is to have a saddle brought out of the proceeds and my son David also And it is my will that my daughter Mary F. Paulins is to have a saddle and one part of the estate After which the remainder shall be equally divided all of my heirs
