 my last will and Testament in manner and form follow-
 ing that is to say: I desire that all my personal property be-
 divided as follows: I wish Esther Murray to have my bed-
 and clothing also the marks top Bureau and fifty Dollars in
 money. I desire that Mary Jane Compton shall have my sewing
 machine; the rest of my household and kitchen furniture I
 leave in the care of my Sister Mrs Matilda C. Compling
 to be divided amongst her children as she thinks best to
 wit: the bed clothing and large rocking chair.
 I wish my Corn Crocking Stoves Clocks & gold & the money
 applied to the payment of my debts. Then I desire that my
 Executors hereafter named shall sell the house and lot on
 which I now live to the best advantage and out of the money
 arising therefrom pay and satisfy all of my just debts
 unpaid at the time of my death and afterwards the re-
 maining money to be equally divided amongst my
 Brothers & Sisters after deducting the money borrowed
 by I said Sammeter & Jacob R. Sammeter from my mother
 to be taken out of their shares and then they are to be made
 equal with the others after the amount of one hundred and
 twenty five Dollars has been applied for the creation of a
 tomb stone for myself and my deceased husband and
 mother. And lastly I do hereby appoint and constitute
 my friends John David Rogers and William R. Browner
 Executors of this my last Will and Will and Testament here-
 by revoking all other wills by me heretofore made. In Witness
 Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal
 this 15th day of November 1875.
