 & whatever can be done by ceremony to be so done I request of my
 Brother in law Will at Washington that for his poor Sister my dear
 little He could become executor of my will my last will and
 testament & be as Moderator in his Charges shall of us he can afford

Then last & I think of my 5 Sons & 2 Daughters for the sake of the family
 God & I have ever held that they will in all things obey their
 beloved Mother in all things particularly to their duty and to
 save the testimony which I have been obliged to give my signature
