

I, Spicy J. J. Heist - of Clarrport - Buckinridge County Ky. being of sound and perfect mind full memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, viz: First - that my husband Samuel Heist shall settle all my business what soever it may be relative to my Father's Estate - and all that may come to me otherwise. I will devise and bequeath to my husband Samuel Heist all my part of the Land that my Father Samuel Paul has bequeathed to me in the second part of his will and testament - also the Negro man James that was willed to me in the first part of his will and all my property, money, notes, and accounts coming to me and also for him to have the use and benefit of the Land that was left to me as long as my Mother (Mary Paul) may live which is expressed in the first part of my Father's will the Negro man, I have traded off for a woman named Beck, my husband to have her and her increase forever also further confirm the above in all and singular in every part to be my will this 21st day of April 1841.
