In the name of God amen the fourteenth day of September 1816 I Stephen Hall of the County of Buchanan and State of Kentucky being very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God for calling unto mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament (that is to say) I give and bequeath to Peter Hall my dearly beloved wife all and singular my lands tenements and townships with every other species of personal and real estate by me to be possessed and enjoyed And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testaments with legacies bequests &c by in any ways before named made and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year above written

Signed sealed pronounced and declared by the said Stephen Hall as his last will and Testament in the presence of us
