I, Susan Tucker of the County of Brackenridge and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and in good health, for me of my age and knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and establish this my last will and testament revoking any heretofore made.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I desire that my Executor hereafter named shall pay my burial expenses and all other just debts I may owe.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> The Homestead where I now live was originally my dower in my husband Kimble Bewley's estate my daughter Martha Wolveston owns her own interest in the same and also the interest of her Sister Caroline Hardaway the remaining interests have been purchased by myself and my daughter Martha Wolveston and in order that it may remain undivided after my death. I give my interest in it to my daughter Martha Wolveston.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my daughter Martha Wolveston the lot of ground, I lot of South War. adjoining the place I live on.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my children Simona Bewley, Amy Nelth, Nancy Adams, Mary Harrison, Caroline Hardaway Malthace Holcomb, and Sarah Henry each one dollar and as two of them viz. Simona Bewley and Mary Harrison are dead. I desire that their heirs shall receive the one dollar given their parents and no more.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Martha Wolveston

all of my household and kitchen furniture Beds and bedding and any <sup>other</sup> all the live stock I may own at my death.

Item 6th I also give my daughter Martha Wolverton all the cash and cash notes I may own at my death.

Item 7th In making this my will. I do it for the purpose of providing a home for my daughter Martha Wolverton who is in poor health. And to enable her to keep the house in repair. I have given her what little money or notes I may have the most of the latter can not be collected without considerable trouble. and also because she has been a source of help and comfort to me in my declining years.

Item 8th I desire that my daughter Martha Wolverton shall be my executor to carry into effect this my will and I further request and desire that the court shall not require her to give bond.
