In the name of God amen I Thomas Alory of Breckinridge County being in
a very low state of health but of disposing mind believing now long I shall come
to a final dissolution and wishing to make such disposition of the little property
I now possess as appears to me to be best for my wife and children do make and
ordains this my last Will & testament. First that all my just debts be paid
secondly that my beloved wife Henrietta have and keep all my estate both
real and personally of every description in her hands for the support of herself
and my children during her widowhood and if at any time she should
think it most advisable to act according to law with my estate I wish her
to do so and at her decease or sooner if it enters her. The one hundred and two
of land on which I now live to descend and to be equally divided between my two
sons Thomas H Alory and Luke Alory forever and I do hereby nominate and
appoint my beloved wife Henrietta my whole and sole executrix of this my last will and
testament and as my debts are few and small and arrangements made to meet most of
them I do not wish my wife to make sale of any of my property unless she should find it
necessary to the payment of debts or not profitable to keep at her own discretion for the
support of herself and the children In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 25th day of February 1820

I William Hardin ~~son~~ of Buchanan County Kentucky knowing that it is appointed once for all to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the following manner to wit 1st It is my will that all my just debts be first paid out of my estate 2nd I do will to my lawful wife Susan Hardin upon her relinquishing her right ^{all} claims to the balance of my estate eight hundred acres of land having her first choice out of any land I specify to be laid off in one of two tracts as she may think proper and to have and to hold the same forever I also will to my wife Susan all my household furniture farming utensils and stock for her natural lifetime and after her death to be ^{the} equal property of my two youngest daughters Hannah and Lucinda Hardin and their heirs forever it is also my will that my wife Susan is to have all the rent corn and what is due me this present season 3rd It is my will that the balance of my estate indiscriminately be equally divided quality and quantity between Henry Hardin Malinda, Beauford, Amelia, Merry, Eliza Davidson John & Hardin John Hardin Mary and Hardin Lucinda Hardin and Eliza Comstock and Lavinia Comstock heirs of Henry and Comstock decd the two latter being entitled to one equal part with the others as their mother would have been entitled to if she were living taking into consideration what each one has received by reference to deeds recorded in the Clerk's Office that those who have received more is to have less to make all my before mentioned heirs equal I do also will unto my son William Hardin three dollars out of my estate and not any thing more out of my estate I do hereby nominate and constitute John & Hardin and Robert Huston my executors giving them full power to appoint commissioners to value all the lands I possess and invest them with authority to have and make a division of the land among my before mentioned heirs as soon as convenient after my death and to it clearly understood that my executors before mentioned have first a right and authority to sell any lands I specify to discharge my just debts In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of June 1821
