

I, William M. Pullan of Buckingham County Clerk of the County being of sound mind & make this my last Will & Testament. I desire that as my just debt be paid - I give & bequeath to my Wife Mary Pullan my two Sons my business all my cooking utensils her spinning wheel & Larder & and horse also one equal third of all the money now & hereafter belonging my wife arising from the sale of my property personal & real & I order that all my property personal & real consisting of my farm houses, cattle hogs, sheep, hoppers, grain &c. to be sold & put into cash & that I reserve for my wife as before named an a third of eight years when the wife & good Son & the remaining two thirds of say the money after setting apart my wife third. I give & bequeath to my children to be equally divided & expended in educating them. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty eight day of July the year of our Lord 1843

I, Thomas Gregory of Buckingham County being of sound mind & disposing memory but knowing the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death & believing it to be the duty of every man to make such a disposition of his temporal affairs as he may desire to take place after his death do therefore make this my last Will & Testament as follows. I have first of my children viz Samuel, Ann G. Minor L. John W. & Mary have each had their proportionate parts of my Estate. I do hereby place in the hands of my wife Sally Gregory the whole of my Estate both real & personal for the following purposes that is to say to pay off the legacies here made in property or money as soon as she come after my death. To my Son Thomas \$25.00 to my Son Peter \$125.00 to my Son Hunter to Gregory \$125.00. I leave to my two grand children Thomas & Elizabeth & Mary Elizabeth Thomasburg \$20 each & if either of them should die before they come to the age of twenty one then the whole amount to return to my heirs the last & residue of my Estate my plantation tract of land & negroes & every thing else, during her widowhood & for the support raising & educating of the youngest children. I devise to my wife Sally Gregory & upon her intermarriage the title of the whole of my Estate here in devised to my said wife to put in my three youngest children or the survivor of them that come in that order she is to have the use & possession of the same until the 3 children come of age & then distribute to each of them a fair proportion the 3 children above named to is Samuel L. Stephen Th. & George M. Gregory &

upon her death the whole of my estate in her hands and herein otherwise devised is to be the absolute estate of my three youngest children or the survivors of them viz James L. Gregory, Stephen H. & George W. Gregory & their heirs forever I wish it to be finally understood that upon my youngest children coming of age I want my wife to distribute to each of the three such portions as she may think proper but they are not to have the right to dispose of her estate her death & I desire to provide her with a home & the negroes wait on her during her life - I do hereby appoint my wife Sally Gregory ex<sup>te</sup> of this my will & as I have never married since I was I want that the least will not require her to give security. I desire that she shall pay my just debts & to do so or for the purpose of carrying out effect this will she is authorized to sell & dispose of any of my estate, made & published as my last will & Testament this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1841 in presence of

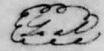

I have all seen by these presents that I have Sally of the County & State aforesaid being admonished of my apprehending disposition by the infirmities of my body & proposing as I do the full & entire exercise of all my intellectual faculties with all the soundness or sanity of mind that ever I enjoyed at any preceding period of my existence do in these presents proceed to make the following disposition of my property to my wife and amongst my children (V<sup>t</sup>) It is my will & desire that all just debts & demands against me shall be fully discharged out of my estate  
2<sup>nd</sup> It is my desire that my wife Mary Sally shall have & hold the remaining part of my estate both personal & real to manage in whatever manner she may see most conducive to the benefit of herself & my children by her investing & reinvesting her at the same time to grant the children if any of them should marry & leave her a dowry her dower &c should her circumstances admit of her so doing the above named estate I will &
