After paying my debts I leave my wife all the money that I may have and all that is coming to my estate I wish her to give my two sons J. R. Hott and W. D. Hott five hundred dollars each when she can collect it.

I Give my wife all the stock I may have also all my household furniture. my wife shall have a right to sell and convey a certain tract of land if she wishes to do so. it is a part of a tract of land I bought of R. S. Hott known as the Toltort land. she can sell and convey all of that tract of land laying west of Town creek I suppose there is 140 or so acres. at my wife death my estate goes to my two children J. R. Hott and W. D. Hott. or their heirs but to be divided by my wife as she may think but the graveyard on my place where my father and mother is buried, and where I expect to be buried, shall not be sold or conveyed by any of my heirs their fifty feet square that belongs to the graveyard and cannot be conveyed by any of my heirs.
