

In the name of God amen I William P Pool of the County of Kent
and State of Kentucky being of Sound mind and memory but in bad health
do make this my last Will & Testament. 1st It is my Will that all my just debts
& funeral expenses be paid. 2^d I leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane
Pool all my landed estate during her Widowhood to be occupied or rented
out by her or so managed by her as she may think best and the proceeds or fruits
of the said landed estate she is to appropriate as she may think right to the support
of herself and children but she is not to dispose of the lands.
3^d I leave & bequeath to my said wife all my negroes during her Widowhood
to be managed as she may deem best (for the interest of herself & children) and
if ^{any} of them become unmanageable or unruly she may hire them out
and apply the money she may receive for hire for the maintenance of her self
and children as she may think best but not for the negroes.
4th I also leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane Pool all my
personal estate (after the first clearing of my Will is completed with) Consisting of
Notes, accounts, horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, farming utensils, household
kitchen furniture & blacksmiths tools and all other property that I may
have not here enumerated to be disposed of as she may claim but for her own
support and for educating and supporting her children. It is my Will &
desire that my wife keep my family together, and with the means I have
put at her disposal in this Will to educate & share out to my children as they
respectively arrive at age such portions of my estate as she can spare without
inconvenience to her self and family then giving to any one child more than
it would have been entitled to had this Will not have been made and should
my wife again marry it is my Will that she receive her third portion of my land
during her life and the third portion of the balance of my estate that may be in
her possession at the time in the manner she should have done had this Will
never have been made. Should she marry it is my Will that she should cease
to act as my executrix. Having full power & confidence in my beloved wife
Jane Pool I hereby constitute and appoint her my executrix of this my last
Will and Testament during her Widowhood and request the Court not to require
of her Security as I can but little. September 10th 1845

debts & funeral expenses all the rest & residue of my estate both real & personal and
every part & parcel thereof I desire to my beloved wife Nancy Finckelbe during her
natural life and after her death what ever of my estate may be then remaining it is
my Will & desire that it should be divided equally between my three Sons Lige W.

Richardson, Richard O. Richardson and Allen Richardson their heirs &c
 I appoint my wife Nancy Richardson Executor of this my last Will and Testament
 and as I am but little in debt and the right of my executor will be thereby perfectly
 I expect the best to permit my Executor aforesaid to qualify as such with out being
 her to give security. I hereby authorize my said Executor to sell and convey away
 of my lands or other property and use the proceeds thereof as she may think
 should I die without making doing consequence for lands hereafter to be sold or
 I may hereafter sell. It is my Will & desire and I hereby authorize my said
 Executor to convey any such lands and any and made by him
 shall be as valid as if made by myself in person in my life time. It is my
 will to do equal justice between all of my children & as some of my children
 have received of me what I consider their reasonable share or portion of my
 estate I have omitted naming them for testimony whereof I have with set my hand
 and seal this 10th day of August 1843

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to her a certain tract or parcel of land situate
 and being on the waters of Rough Creek and Spanish Creek in the town
 of Buchanan and State of Kentucky containing seven hundred acres or
 more to hold to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my beloved Mother Deborah Habigau a
 certain lot of land and a tract of land on the premises in consideration of the said
 land being her favorite on them.

Item 4th I hereby appoint my beloved wife Nancy Th. Habigau Sole
 Executor of this my last Will and Testament with full power and right to sell
 and dispose of the whole of my estate both real and personal on any point
