I Thomas N. Wright of Breckinridge County Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory do ordain and Establish this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills.

I will that all my personal property except such articles as are by law allotted to widows & infant children shall be paid and the proceeds be applied to the payment of my
 Executors Just debts.

I will It is my will and wish that my Executors to be hereafter named shall take charge of my farm and negro slaves and apply the products of the farm and the proceeds of the labour of the Slaves to the support of my wife and infant children so far as may be necessary for that purpose and the surplus to be applied to the payment of my Just debts until they are all paid off.

I will After my debts are all extinguished I will that my wife and minor children shall be decently supported and the children educated out of the proceeds of the land and slaves and that no after charges shall be made against them for it when they shall arrive at majority and that that provision is to continue until the youngest child shall arrive to the age of twenty One years or shall marry at which time such distribution or division or disposition of the land and Slaves may be made as the heirs & devisees may agree upon among themselves reserving always to my wife her dower right if she chooses to exact them.

I will I further will that my wife and minor children shall occupy the manor House on my farm until my youngest child shall become of age or shall marry and that they the minor children shall be under the especial care and Guardianship of their mother.

I will I appoint my Son in law John B. Manning and my son William A. Wright Executors of this my last will and Testament Witness my hand and Seal this fourth day of June One Thousand Eight hundred and fifty five
