It is my wish that my executor or executors hereafter named should first & at all my life of tobacco, all my stock of horses except one good horse & both, all my stock of sheep, cattle & other stock property except so much as my wife shall wish to keep for her own use, that should the said wife be sufficient to pay all my just debts it is my desire that so much of the tract of land on which I have lived, shall be sold by my executor or executor off the side so as to insure the same as little as possible to pay the remainder of my debts. 3^d after my death the price - it is my wish & desire that my wife hold the balance of my estate for the use & benefit of herself & her children & at her death, then the property to come to my present children, I hereby certify that my friend James Henry my executor to carry this my last will & testament into effect. Given under my hand the 25th day of November 1843.

Jennings.

I Alexander M. Causey of Buckinridge County and State of Kentucky do make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to Say: I desire that all my personal Estate be sold after my deceased amount of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid shall be my personal estate proceeds sufficient for the above purposes I desire several of my land to be sold as will be sufficient to pay such of my just debts as shall remain unpaid out of the sale of my personal estate.

1st After paying my just debts and funeral expenses I give to my daughter Nancy McLean two hundred dollars amount of bank bonds which is now in the hands of Alexander McLean Esq. I also give to my daughter Nancy McLean a Negro Woman Adeline during her natural life and then to devolve to my other children.

2nd I give all the balance of my Estate both real and personal equally between my three children (to wit) John McLean, Nancy McLean and Alexander McLean Esq. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons John McLean and Alexander McLean Esq. Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made in Writing when I have been in full of my mind and affixed my Seal this the sixteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three
