of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.

Hempsey one Christian name is Polly the other Catherine they have married men whose
names I do not exactly know but to each of them I give and bequeath the sum of two
hundred dollars to them for ever and their heirs for ever Signed sealed and set for

I also desire that my brother Roberts act as my Executor and that he be not required to give Security, and that he as Executor pay promptly all claims that are legal that may be against me.
