 this my last will and testament, I  
 give bequeath and devise my estate and  
 property as follows, first I devise to my  
 Mother Susan Warren all of my land  
 for her use and benefit her lifetime and  
 after her death the said land to go to  
 my nephews Charles Lewis and Thomas  
 Edward Warren I also give to James  
 & Harri Manah Liatu and Priscilla  
 Roberts fifty dollars each, I also give  
 to the Flint & Bland Catholic Church  
 fifty dollars, I also will that enough  
 of my loose property be sold to pay  
 my Doctor bill and all other debts  
 against me and if there is not enough  
 of said property to pay said debts  
 my nephew Charles Lewis & Thomas Ed-  
 ward Warren to pay out of said land.  
 I also bequeath to my niece Mary  
 Warren one cupboard and I bequeath  
 to my niece Elizabeth Warren one bed-  
 stead and bedding, they to have pos-  
 session at the death of my mother. I  
 also bequeath to my nephews James & John  
 B. Warren one acre a piece, I appoint  
 John Pipe a Farmer of Breckenridge  
 County Kentucky, executor of this my will  
 In witness whereof I have signed and  
 sealed this instrument and published  
 and declare the same as for my last  
 will. In witness whereof I have signed  
 and sealed this instrument and pub-  
 lished and declare the same as for  
 my last will at my residence in  
 Breckenridge County Kentucky, on the 3<sup>rd</sup>  
 day of March 1881. Thomas Warren <sup>his</sup> mark
