my body to the earth to be buried. Secondly, I do hereby give all my
Will is that my Wife Elizabeth to have & to keep & to possess one, as my estate
both real & personal producing her natural lifetime Subject to the discharge
of my personal expenses & the payment of my just debts during her lifetime & if
and in case she should marry I do appoint Jonathan Hay my Executor
to take with possession all my estate both real & personal & to keep it until
the death of my Wife Elizabeth then to divide it equal between my two children
F. M. Hay's heirs & George Hay and in case that George Hay should marry
have any heirs, at his death my Will is that his half of my estate shall go
equally between Valentine Hay & Jonathan Hay. And as I am but little
acquainted of the Court that they do not require Security of Jonathan Hay
my Executor, believing he will discharge his duty. Therefore I have
after the death of my Wife Elizabeth that there shall be a Sale of all my property
according to law. And hereby revoking & annulling all and every
former Will and do declare this to be my last Will & Testament.
