 Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, in view of
 the uncertainty of life, being of sound mind
 and disposing memory, hereby make an &
 ordain this my last will and Testament, hereby
 revoking and making void all others, that have
 been made by me
 First, Having given to each of my children who
 have married and left me, money or its equiv-
 alent to the amount of One hundred dollars,
 also one bed and bedding, One cow and calf
 and One head of sheep, I will that my two
 children who live yet with me, viz. Moses and
 Emily have each the same amount and in
 addition one Saddle and Bridle to the value of
 Eighteen dollars, and in addition that my
 two youngest children, viz. Moses and Emily
 shall have the privilege of going to school
 twelve months to be paid for out of my estate
 and also will that my wife Francis Ray

have all of my estate after paying my just debts so long as shall remain unmarried and in case she shall marry again, then she is to have one third part of my estate during life and then at her death, I will that all my estate be equally divided among all of my children, viz: Thomas L Ray, William A Ray, Jane Bassham, Sarah Ellen Kelton, James M Ray, Richard Ray, Margaret Cashman, Frances Barga, Moses Ray and Emily Ray. I appoint my wife Frances Ray and Thomas L Ray and William A Ray Executors of this my last will and Testament.
