one cow I have given to James W Greenwell one horse
saddle and Saddle and one bed and clothing I have
given to George W Greenwell one horse saddle and Saddle
and one bed and clothing I have given to my daughter
Ann Taylor one horse saddle and Saddle and one bed
and clothing as to the balance of my property I will
and bequeath all of my property to my wife

Anastasia Greenwell after my death one half so long
as she lives and at her death all the property to go to my
three youngest children equally divided between the three
Helen Greenwell and Elsie Greenwell Henry W
Greenwell I will Margaret Sumble one doll I will
and bequeath to Helen Greenwell fifty acres of land
one and also his part In testimony whereof I have
set my hand and affixed my seal And Seal this
sixth day of March one thousand Eight hundred
and fifty six I appoint my Son James W Greenwell
Executor I wish him to transact the business pertaining
to this very last will and testament without being required
by the county Court of Buckenridge to give
Security whatever In testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my Seal this 6 day
of March 1856

John Webb of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others a former will I do give my daughter Mary Webb the following property West Desereta and her increase Washington Amanda and her increase of any & seeds and furniture chair of my horses & cows 11 sheep and the land on which I live after her mother and my death to have her equal her brothers John H Webb and John S Webb If any of the above negroes should die before she takes them into his possession she is to have the amount in something else All the balance of my estate both personal real & my wife Elizabeth during her lifetime and at her death I wish it to be equally divided between my son John H Webb, Mary L Webb, Mary E Webb daughters of John S Webb deceased if she should not have and heir the property shall return to my other children after the death of my wife in the division of the negroes I wish the the family to be put together as much as they can the old woman is to choose to which of the children they go with without charge and if any of them shall have a charge my executor shall pay the appraisers shall think right to keep them from being charged or any as they have raised them the children I think this much is right I hereby do appoint my son John H Webb this my last will and Testament done this 25 day of July 1855
