 testament hereby declaring at hitherto made by me, I do it now particularly
 in view of having children among whom the law of my country would not
 distribute a distribution of my property contrary to my wish did & since
 the names of these children are as follows to wit: My daughter Elizabeth Musgrave
 Lucy Emma bick Richardson Ready Pinn Peggy Brown Polly Barham
 wife of Wm Barham and my son Wm Barham and my grand children
 Nancy Barham and Polly Barham children of my son Wm Barham
 to the above named children & grand children I have nothing except my
 wish for their prosperity having hitherto given them and the father of my grand
 children all that I ever intended to have given them. I now therefore have and
 bequeath of my estate in the manner and form following to wit:

1st After my funeral expenses are paid I have and bequeath to my son
 Barham Barham and his heirs & to his heirs & to his heirs & to his heirs & to his heirs
 on which I now live being a part of an hundred and thirty acres tract
 which I purchased of Charles Curren & wife. I also give and bequeath
 to him all my stock of every description my farming utensils my house hold
 and kitchen furniture but during his mother's life and she is to retain her share out of
 all I have given my said son Barham if she survives I have & bequeath all the afore
 property to the afore said Barham not only on account of the natural love and
 affection I have for him as a son but for the sake & service I have received of
 him by me 3rd I give and bequeath to my son in law Stephen Nottingham
 fifty acres of land including the on which he now lives being the balance
 of the afore said hundred & thirty two acres tract and I do hereby appoint my
 afore said son Barham and my son in law Stephen Nottingham my executors
 of this my last will and testament. Given under my hand and seal
