Brookenside County & State of Kentucky being of sound mind
after saying my last debts & personal Expenses I bequeath

to my beloved wife Judith Carmile all my estate both personal
& real to have and to hold the same during her widowhood but
her death my property both real and mixed I wish to be Equally
divided amongst my children William Eliza John James George
Zachariah Mary and my grand child John C. Carmile the
son of a daughter Eliza Inman all debts owing that may be
coming to me from Virginia I likewise will to my wife as
above ~~Eliza~~ ^{Eliza} & at any time my wife may wish to give to any
of my children or my grand child John C. Carmile any of the
property she may wish after having the same valued by two
disinterested persons selected by herself so as to make all of my
children & grand child ^{above named} equal in portion of property I further make and
appoint my son William I Carmile my Executor
in testimony whereof I hereby set my hand and seal this 2nd day
of October 1854

Examined In the name of god I, William Blain of Brookenside County and
State of Kentucky being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory knowing
the uncertainty of life and certainty of Death deem it important to make the following
Will or distribution of my property (Test) I do hereby bequeath to my daughter
Mary Mary and her Children the hundred acres of land occupied by her for
several years past as set forth in a title Bond before her first marriage provided
said Mary should ever have any Children and said Children should die before
they are twenty one years of age then said land to return to my other heirs at
her death and in addition to said one hundred acres I add fifty acres on the west side
in the same manner as the other said one hundred and fifty acres of land being one
hundred and twenty Rods wide from east to west and two hundred and seven
Rods Long from North to South Containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less
said land to be equally divided at said Marys death Between the heirs of Thomas
Blain her son and the heirs of Jane and Robert John that is to say twenty five acres
to the heirs of Thomas Blain Deceased and twenty five acres to the heirs of Jane and
Robert John the remaining fifty acres of land on the west side Between said 151 acres
East and Hiram Patterson land which I claim as my own property and

Intend to sell or have sold by my executor Robert Tobin for my deffunct and lawful heirs
 the remaining one hundred acre of land lying between the aforesaid two hundred
 acres of land and thirty acres formerly conveyed to Thomas Blain and being half the
 length of the two hundred acre parcel south to North and the same width from
 East to West said one hundred acre parcel with one thousand Dollars I give
 to the heirs of Thomas Blain Deceased at said price also a note which I hold for five
 hundred Dollars bearing interest on said Thomas Blain Deceased which note by the time
 the guardians are chosen and a final Settlement made of said Thomas Blain's Estate
 said note will be worth five hundred and fifty Dollars in the next place there will be
 expected to be added two hundred and fifty acres of land one third of the proceeds of
 a negro Slave to be shortly sold said Thomas Blain received herefor two hundred
 and sixteen Dollars and thirty three cents are due the price of a slave sold a few years
 ago which went to the benefit of said Thomas Estate and now being out of the reach of
 guardians cannot slide round to complete the sum of total of two thousand Dollars
 Sales give to Jane and Robert Tobin five hundred Dollars worth of land on Little
 Yellow bank Creek as set forth in a title Bond given Mary Blain said land to be
 sold immediately if practicable for the convenience of conveying the land myself if it
 cannot be sold now to be sold as soon as convenient for the benefit of the heirs of Jane
 and Robert Tobin I hold a note on said Robert Tobin for five hundred Dollars which on
 final Settlement will be worth five hundred and fifty Dollars which I also give
 to Jane and Robert Tobin said Jane and Robert Tobin having herefor received two
 hundred and sixteen Dollars and thirty three cents are due of a negro Slave sold a
 year or two ago said money having been immediately paid for and entered for their
 heirs also two hundred Dollars said Tobin received of Henry Sullivan and two hundred
 and fifty Dollars expected to be added shortly one third the proceeds of another Slave to be
 sold a short time from this the residue to make the amount of two thousand Dollars
 to be made up in due time for the convenience of the aforesaid land The other third of
 the Slave Sarah expected to be shortly sold is intended for my Daughter Mary Henry
 I do hereby constitute Robert Tobin my sole executor in testimony whereof I have written
 my hand and seal day and year above Written
