I consider that the property that I have given of to my children would make them all about equal except James M. Bruce and William W. R. Bruce. I consider that I gave them fifty dollars a piece more than ~~I gave~~ the others in the land that I sold them and I will that in the division that James M. Bruce & William W. R. Bruce receive fifty dollars each less than the rest of my children I will that James B. Howard & James M. Bruce act as Executors to this my will and have me decently buried and have a tombstone placed at my grave about like the one that I placed at my wives grave which is to be paid for before admision done the 20th day of August 1876. as witness my hand and; William Bruce

The last Will and Testament of Alexander St. Beauchamp of Breckinridge Co. Ky

I A. St. Beauchamp considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say,

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret Ann Beauchamp and my youngest daughter Cornelia L. Casey.

Item I give and bequeath my home tract ^{situated} including my residence consisting of 250 acres more or less as per deed to be shared equally by them during the life of my wife Margaret A. Beauchamp and at her death my youngest daughter ~~daughter~~ Cornelia L. Casey is to become her sole heir in the foregoing described land.

Item I further give and bequeath to my wife Margaret A. Beauchamp all my personal property consisting in cash and cash notes farming implements stock household and kitchen furniture to pay all my just debts after the distribution ^{made} I shall further make here in.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Elizabeth Arit 88 acres of land known as the Bain tract of land she to pay back to my wife Margaret A. Beauchamp \$250.⁰⁰

Item I give and bequeath to my son J. St. Beauchamp 200 acres of land known as the Wheeler tract of land also 88 acres of land known as the Ball tract of land as per deeds, he to pay back to my wife Margaret A. Beauchamp \$300.⁰⁰

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Georgia Ann Robertson \$600.⁰⁰

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Eugene J. Beauchamp enough to make with what I have given him heretofore \$1000.⁰⁰ the amount not to exceed \$250.⁰⁰

Item I give and bequeath my life insurance policy which I hold in the Masonic Life Insurance Co. to be shared equally by my heirs, Margaret A. Beauchamp Georgia A. Robertson Betty Arit E. J. Beauchamp John W. Beauchamp and Cornelia L. Casey. Lastly I hereby appoint my son Eugene J. Beauchamp my sole executor of this my last Will and Testament without any expense of Court.
