Lang considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound and perfect mind & memory (Helped by Holy Spirit God be the same) do make this my last Will and Testament in a manner & form following (Wiz) I first I commend my body to the good and my Soul to God who gave it I then devise my funeral expenses to be paid and I desire that all my just shall be paid if there is property enough belonging to my estate to do it exclusive of what the law allows my wife and children there to more than will satisfy those debts I desire it to be distributed equally among my children for their education or in what ever way my wife Elizabeth Ann & Stephen McCracken may think proper and I hereby appoint Stephen McCracken and my wife Elizabeth Ann in conjunction Executors & Executive of this my last will and testament here by revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 25th day March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty two 1842
