of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate
as it hath pleased God to bless and With P. I give and bequeath to my
daughter Rebecca Ann Shelling, a servant boy fifty three or by the
name of Jago, Lotty and Eliza and Sugar Bush.

Duly I give and bequeath to my daughter Abigail Elliott and her and her heirs and assigns one half of the one half share of the estate of the late
 one Charles and wife I do give and bequeath to my second Son to wit
 Albert G. Elliott Richard H. Elliott, James A. Elliott, John H. Elliott
 & Edw. H. Elliott all of my lands to be equally divided between them
 I do give and bequeath to my Son James A. Elliott & John H. Elliott
 and Edw. H. Elliott and heirs, Charles & Burdett each as they become of
 of age my thirty and year of age the share which James A. Elliott
 now has to be his and not entitled to an other. I do give and bequeath
 to my fine Son above named all of my stock of any description my
 household and kitchen furniture also my wagon and grain and
 farming utensils. I do give and bequeath to my Son William D. Elliott
 one hundred dollars when my Son Edw. H. Elliott arrives to twenty
 and year of age which money shall be paid out of the part of my
 fine Son. I request the Court not to require Security of my Executor
 I do not wish any abridgment of my property whatever and lastly
 I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Albert G. Elliott
 Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all
 other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made. In testimony whereof
 I have written this my hand and affixed my seal this 30th day of
 December 1846.

The within Writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of William Elliott dec^d was produced in Court and duly proven by the oath of George P. Henson and James T. Henson Subscribers to the same to be the last Will and Testament of the said William Elliott and the same was ordered by the Court to be Recorded. Attestation M. C. Chasty D.C. 1866

I Elijah C. Pulliam of Buckingridge County and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory but in full health do make and establish this my last Will and Testament touching all other Wills thereto or made by me. 1st It is my Will and desire that after my death that my body be decently buried and funeral expences paid. 2nd It is my Will and desire that all my just debts be paid. 3rd It is my Will and desire that my Executrix herein after named may Live either privately or publicly on such Credits as she may think best. So much of my personal property as she can conveniently spare to go toward the payment of my debts and as I think there is not enough personal property to spare for that purpose It is my Will and desire that if my Executrix shall think best she is authorized to Live not exceeding 100 acres of land the same or which (Valentine) Butcher holds a lease to be laid off into convenient parcels as my Executrix may see proper. 4th It is my Will and desire that after the payment of my just debts that my beloved Wife Betty Pulliam shall have all my Real and personal Estate of every description during her life or life tenor. With the following proviso that as my children may become of age or marry that she let them have a share each at least of equal value as is the custom of the Country and such other property as she can conveniently spare or may think proper to give them making them as near equal as possible. 5th It is my Will and desire that if my Wife Betty Pulliam should be disposed to get married then in that event it is my Will and desire that my Wife Betty Pulliam shall have the use and benefit of my three worn Expensive and black women Wills and one third part of land including the Mansion house and one third part of all the personal property for and during her natural life. 6th It is my Will and desire that after the death of my dear beloved Wife that my property both Real and personal shall be equally divided between my three children Mary B. Pulliam Martha B. Pulliam and Charles B. Pulliam. It is my Will and desire that the Negroes that my Executrix may let say I own these have and those that may fall to them after the death of my beloved Wife shall go to them (that is) to my daughters Mary B. Pulliam and Martha B. Pulliam and to their children. 7th It is my Will and desire that my beloved Wife Betty Pulliam act as my Executrix in this my last Will and Testament and she is hereby authorized if she think best to make sale of a portion of my land to convey the same to the purchaser by a good and sufficient deed. 8th It is my Will and desire in the event that my said Executrix refused to act or die that my said Executrix then it is my Will and desire that my brother Henson M. Pulliam or John Beard or either of them act as my Executrix and it is my Will and desire that the Court may permit my said Executrix or Executrix to qualify without giving Security Signed Subscribed and delivered in presence of the undersigned at the County Court of Buckingridge County Kentucky this 11th day of February 1866
