

In the name of God, I William Gannaway of the County of Breckenridge and State of Kentucky, being in Body but of sound mind and disposing memory, for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner as following that is to say I give &c

I First to John Gannaway my son now living in the State of Illinois and Thomas Gannaway my son now living on my farm I give my farm or Tract of land where I now live to my two above named sons for and during their life and then to their heirs to be Equally divided between them and there being but one Spring on said farm and they shall have Equal Rights to the same nor shall said Tract of land or farm ever be sold to pay any debt my son John or my son Thomas now wives or may hereafter Contract. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of November 1865.
