in the Negroes Sam and Henry and all the share above my interest in the land
deeded me by my father also my land as granted to my mother Sarah Dean during her
natural life from D^d I did and bequeath to my brother John Dean ~~the~~ the death of
my mother my interest in and with the above said Negro Sam and his heirs ~~last~~
first Sam D^d I did and bequeath to my brother Gammon Dean, Polly Dean
Peggy Kirkmire and Rachel Dean my interest in the Negro girl I left my mother during
her life, after the death of my mother Sarah Dean my desire is that my brother Gammon
Dean and sister above named have said Negro girl Mary Dean my interest in the tract
of land that my mother had on as Bldg. run by my father also my interest in the share
of every kind that I have interest in also all the money that may be owing to me
from Samuel McGlarty or John person to be equally divided among them and
their heirs forever with the income of said Negro girl. Item 5th For the love and
affection of my sister Polly Dean and Rachel Dean in my things I give and
bequeath both present and to be sold my whole and all my belongings to be equally
divided between them, their heirs and their heirs forever. 6th My wish is that the property
I have Bldg. my sister Kirkmire that she have and enjoy it during her life and to be
equally divided among her children and said Henry Kirkmire is to have one cent
more it in any way my interest in it. 7th Item I do hereby appoint my brother John Dean
as executor and if he refuse all former wills do make conditions void and this my last will and testament
I do make and do in execution to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof

County and State of Kentucky being in sound mind but infirm health
knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death after resigning my heart to God
and gave it I make this my last will and testament after paying all my just debts
I leave to my beloved wife Frances Glopcock the farm on which I now reside with
all the appurtenances also all my personal estate to dispose of as she may think proper for
the use of herself and children during life or in case of her death or marriage
I wish all my property divided equally amongst my children viz, John B. Glopcock

Glopcock William H. Glopcock Martha S. Glopcock Susan W. Glopcock
George D. Glopcock and many as my wife may have during my life or within
nine months after my death. Lastly I appoint John H. Wiley my executor

I also empower my executor to sell the land that I purchased of Robert Wright
to the best advantage he can by laying them off in tracts to suit the purchasers also
to make deeds to said lands and to all the same that I have sold, that is not named
Shall be John H. Sharkey and to be qualified to act as my executor. I authorize my
attorney to sell the within named lands and make deeds thereunto
as witness my hand and seal this 15th day of November 1838.

I Sally Green of the County of Buckhannon and Commonwealth of Maryland
being sick and weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby
make my last will and testament in manner and form following viz. It is my
will and desire that after my decease all my personal property (what is herein after
particularly disposed of) shall be sold by my executor to be here in after named to the
highest bidder on a credit of twelve months and out of the proceeds thereof I give
unto John H. Sharkey Daniel Green & Samuel M. Sharkey all my just debts and funeral
expences to be paid. It is my will and desire that my Negro Woman Nancy shall
have her choice to live with any of my brother or sister or their children or with
any of my deceased brother's children and that they shall not be bound to pay anything
for her. It is also my will that my Negro Girls Nancy Ellen and Betty shall have
their choice to live with any of my brother or sister or with any of their children or
with any of my deceased brother's, at a reasonable price according to their age and station
not to exceed four hundred dollars and if there should be any considerable fall in the
price of Negroes then - proportionate deduction in the value and a reasonable benefit
given to be judged of by my executor. It is my will and desire that my Nephew
Thomas Green shall have the land on which he now lives by paying one half the
value thereof to his sister Sally Green. It is my will that my Nephews William
Mason and John W. Green and my Nieces Lucina Green and Sally Ann Green
shall each have fifty dollars out of the proceeds of the sale of my estate.

It is also my will that my brother Grant Green's daughter Elizabeth and my
brother Joseph Green's daughter Isabella shall each have a third part of my
estate and that brother Daniel Green's two youngest children Elizabeth and Joseph
shall each have the value of a bed out of what the said Daniel Green is owing
me. It is my will and desire that the balance of my estate after paying my
just debts and funeral expences and taking out the above named legacies shall be
divided among legates in the following manner viz. one fourth part to each of
my brothers John Green Robert Green Grant Green Daniel Green and Joseph
Green and that one fourth be equally divided between my deceased brother Thomas
Green's children and that one fourth part be equally divided between my deceased brother
William Green's children and one fourth part be equally divided between my
