D<sup>d</sup>. It is my wish that my Executor or Executors hereafter named should  
shall just & well my body of Tobacco, all my stock of horses except one  
Saddled horse with all my stock of Hogs, cattle & other loose property  
except so much as my wife shall wish to use for her own use, then should  
the debt not be sufficient to pay all my just debts it is my desire that so much  
of the tract of land on which I now reside, shall be sold by my Executor  
or Executors off the side so as to raise the sum as little as possible to pay  
the remainder of my debts I<sup>d</sup> after my debts be paid - it is my Will & desire  
that my wife hold the balance of my estate for the use & benefit of her self & children  
& after death, then the property is given to my present children. I hereby consti-  
tute my friend James Henry my Executor to carry this my last Will & Testament  
into effect. Given under my hand the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November 1843.

beloved wife Lucinda Davis all the lands immoveable tenements &c. at the  
free stock and on the whole all the goods, chattels and implements of my  
disposition that I am now possessed of having given my daughter Malinda  
Wood one hundred and fifty Dollars, and when my dearly beloved Son  
and his mother shall have let my other free daughters on a horse with  
their sister my wife shall then be bound to convey to Egna Davis a certain tract  
piece of land lately bought of J. Jennings.
