 upon it so as such shall be out fairly between the children and if my wife Thomas Wood
 should marry again it is my will that her trusteeship of my estate cease and that
 she no longer have any control over my estate and that guardians for my children
 be appointed and such division of all my estate that may be necessary take place
 as should have taken place by law had I not done more this will and I hereby
 constitute and appoint my wife Frances Wood my executrix of this my last will
 and Testament and against her to serve as such and in the management of her from
 to advise and counsel with Richard H. Baxter Jr. John Wood and a sufficient number of their
 counsel as she may think best and as to her duty in the execution of this will
 counsel with Nathan Board and D. J. Stephens or either of them. I do hereby
 appoint the last will to require security of my wife Frances Wood as executrix of this
 my last will and Testament as it shall be necessary for her to give it and my estate
 is amply sufficient to pay all my debts. In testimony of this my last will and

I do further charge the property hereby recorded to Dudley Hamilton with the sum of said dollar to be paid to my brother James & William or to be paid to my brother Richard & William and said dollar to my sister Eliza Carter. The principal devise are made to Richard & William and Dudley Hamilton instead of my relations in consequence of the friendship they have always shown me and the kindness & assistance I have in my sickness. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Dudley Hamilton Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 8th day of December 1848. Acknowledged & published before me as the last Will & Testament of Mr. Blair by him and the subscribers set names at his request as witnesses thereto in his presence on the 8th day of December 1848. The words "this" in the Title of the Testator intended before signed.
