

In the name of God amen I William P Pool of the County of Kent
and State of Kentucky being of Sound mind and memory but in last health
do make this my last Will & Testament. 1st It is my Will that all my just debts
& funeral expenses be paid. 2^d I leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane
Pool all my landed estate during her Widowhood to be occupied or rented
out by her or so managed by her as she may think best and the proceeds or fruits
of the said landed estate she is to appropriate as she may think right to the support
of herself and children but she is not to alien or dispose of the land.
3rd I leave & bequeath to my said wife all my negroes during her Widowhood
to be managed as she may deem best (for the interest of herself & children) and
if either of them becomes unmanageable or unruly she may hire them out
and apply the money she may receive for hire for the maintenance of her self
and children as she may think best but not sell the negroes.
4th I also leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane Pool all my
personal estate (after the first clause of my will is complied with) consisting of
notes, accounts, horses, cattle, hogs, &c. &c. farming utensils, household
kitchen furniture & black & white tools and all other property that I may
have not here enumerated to be disposed of as she may deem best for her own
support and for educating and supporting her children. It is my Will &
desire that my wife keep my family together and with the means I have
put at her disposal in the Will to educate & share out to my children as they
respectively arrive at age such portions of my estate as she can spend without
inconvenience to her self and family now giving to my and child more than
it would have been entitled to had this Will not have been made and should
my wife again marry it is my Will that she receive her third portion of my land
during her life and the third portion of the balance of my estate that may be in
her possession at the time in the manner she should have done had this Will
never have been made. Should she marry it is my Will that she should cease
to act as my executrix. Having full faith & confidence in my beloved wife
Jane Pool I hereby constitute and appoint her my executrix of this my last
Will and Testament during her Widowhood and request the Court not to require
of her Security as I saw but little. September 10th 1845

and Testament & follow to wit. It is my Will and desire that all my just debts

debts & funeral expenses all the rest & residue of my estate both real & personal and
every part & parcel thereof I desire to my beloved wife Nancy Tinsdale during her
natural life and after her death the whole of my estate may for then to remain as it is
my Will & desire that it shall be divided equally between my three sons Joseph W.
