

I William Skillman of the County of
 Breckenridge Kentucky, do make this my last
 will and Testament. I desire that my
 just debts and funeral expenses be paid
 and I will & devise all the residue of my
 estate to my wife Lucy Skillman to use
 hold & enjoy during her life and at her
 death the real estate and what remains
 of my personal estate to be sold by my
 Executor hereinafter named for cash or
 on credit, as he may deem expedient
 if on a credit taking bond & approved
 surety of the purchaser & also retaining a
 lien on the land for the payment of the
 purchase money. The proceeds of sale to
 be divided as follows viz: Whereas I
 have advanced to my daughter, Sister
 Mary died the sum of \$382.50 to R S
 Skillman \$382.50 to W S Skillman \$182.50
 to H S Skillman \$172.50 to Milton Skillman
 \$640 and to A Wallace Skillman \$155-
 Now my will & desire is that the children
 & legal representatives of Sister Ann
 Mary died and my above named
 children - R S Skillman, W S Skillman
 H S Skillman and A Wallace Skillman
 by each made equal to Milton Skillman
 that is each of them to receive a sum
 when added to the sum already received
 as above stated will amount to the sum
 of \$640 the amount advanced to Milton
 Skillman and then the residue to be
 equally divided between the said Milton
 and the above named heirs the children
 of the said Sister Mary taking only
 what she would have been entitled to
 if living. I do not intend that my son
 Amos Skillman shall have any part
 of my remaining estate what I have
 advanced to him heretofore with the loss
 & injuries I have sustained by reason
 of this improper & unfair dealings with
 him is so much, as I am inclined to
 give him and considerably more than
 I think he is entitled to - The sums ad-
 vanced are taken from a book in
 which I kept a statement of the advance-
 ments with some additions this day made
 the excess over said accounts and the
 statement, all this transferred were made

without my knowledge authority or consent
and if transferred whose transferred or
for what purpose does not know — The same
advanced to each as stated above to be-
lieve to be correct. I hereby constitute and
appoint Richard C. Stillman executor of this
my last will and testament — and invest
him with all the powers given to my ex-
ecutor — and in addition; to make a deed
of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers
of the land. In testimony whereof I here to
subscribe my name this 16th day of Sept-
ember 1880.
