I William B Stith of the County of Breckenridge and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory and desiring to make a different disposition of my property from that made by law should I die intestate do make this my last will and testament

First It is my will that out of my estate my executor herein after named pay all my just debts and funeral expenses

Second after the payment of my debts and funeral expenses I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Stith all the net residue and remainder of all my estate real personal and mixed and of whatever kind and character to be sold receipt used enjoyed or disposed of by her in any way she may desire during her life and after her death what so ever may remain of said estate is to equally divided between my children and if any of my children should die before said division then their portion shall go to their heirs

Third In the event that my wife shall sell any of my real estate I hereby authorize empower and direct my executor to make suitable and sufficient deeds of conveyances for said property to the purchaser or purchasers

Fourth I hereby constitute and appoint my son in law Alfred Miller executor of my estate and as I owe but little I request the Court to permit him to qualify as such without security

Fifth I have notes and accounts due me some of which are on insolvent persons I request my executor to use such diligence in collecting them as he would were they his own and to put my estate to as little costs as possible and he is not to be held responsible for failure to collect said insolvent notes and accounts
