County Court February Term 1838

The within writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Robert Hutto dead was exhibited in Court and duly read by the clerks of James Owen & James Owen Solicitors at whose table the said Robert Hutto signed sealed published & declared said writing to be his last will & testament that they believed that at the time of making the same he was of sound mind and disposing memory and that they subscribed their names witnesses thereto in his presence and before the said Clerk of the Court one of the justices therein named made oath to the same in due form and therefore the same is ordered to be recorded

I William Morrison of the County of Buchanan & State of Kentucky being of sound mind & disposing memory do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say
1st I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Morrison after the payment of my debts of any after my decease & funeral expenses the plantation whereon I now live also my two negro men Sam & George and my two negro women Betty and Lotty and all my stock of Horses Cattle Sheep & Hogs also one bed of furniture houses & kitchen furniture & plantation utensils during her natural life or widowhood except as is herein after directed Ind I give to my son Lewis Morrison my two negro boys Jacob & Washington who are now in his possession one negro girl Rebecca & her increase also one hundred acres of land including my Sugar Camp agreeably to the boundaries mentioned in the deed of the Sugar Camp tract of land to him & his heirs forever
3rd I give to my daughter Jane Owen my negro girl Milly & her increase & my negro girl Eliza & her increase which two negroes are now in her possession to her & her heirs forever ^{Life} I give to my daughter Nancy Owen my negro boy Isaac & my negro girl Caroline their increase the said negroes being now in her possession to her & her heirs forever
4th I give to my daughter Lucretia Owen my negro boy Russell & my negro girl Fanny their increase said negroes now in her possession to her & her heirs forever ^{Life} I give to my son Jeph Morrison the land and plantation whereon I now live after the death of my wife Elizabeth or in case she should marry at the time of her marriage or so much thereof as she cannot lawfully claim during her life also my will is that my said son Jeph should have my negro boy Nat also my negro girl Fancilda their increase also Lucy & her increase also two beds of furniture two Cow stables and after the decease of my wife Elizabeth or in case she should marry for him to have my bureau & cupboard & its furniture it is also my desire that after my death my son Jeph Morrison & my wife Elizabeth should live together & enjoy equal benefits of my said plantation stock utensils &c during her natural life or widowhood if they think proper and if they should not agree to do so that they divide the same in a way that they can enjoy the benefits of the same & live

apart & after her decease that my son John have all the farming interests to him & his heirs forever 7th It is my desire that after the decease of my wife Elizabeth that my negro man David & George & my negro woman Betty & Lucy & their increase if any be by my executors to be hereafter named or such of them as may qualify and act or by the parties themselves as they may choose equally divided among my following children to wit James Monahan William Monahan John Monahan Mary Edson Milard Sinking and Elizabeth Webb and that all the rest of my estate both Real & personal of what nature it shall seem it may be not herein particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divided among my several children herein before named which I give to them their heirs & assigns forever 8th It is my desire that if my wife Elizabeth should marry again after my decease that she shall have no more of my estate than the Law will allow her and lastly I hereby constitute & appoint my son Lewis Monahan & my son in law John Webb and Grant Owen Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other former Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the 30th day of March 1827 (Intended before signed with the said Family before the first line)

At a County Court began and held for the County of Brockings and State of Indiana at the Court house in Hardinsburg on Monday the first day of February 1829 the within writing purporting to be the last will & testament of William Monahan deceased was produced in Court by John Webb one of the Executors therein named and was duly proved by the oath of Thomas Owen & Amos Watkins subscribing themselves thereto who made oath that the said William Monahan signed sealed published and declared the said Writing to be his last will & testament that they believed him at the time of sound mind & disposing memory and that they subscribed their names themselves thereto in his presence which is ordered to be recorded and therefore John Webb one of the Executors therein named made oath to the said will in due form & with James Monahan William Monahan & James Edson his securities entered into and acknowledged bond in the penalty of \$1000 conditioned agreeably to Law and therefore Certificate of the probate thereof is granted him in due form
