I, Emma Claycomb of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, being sound in mind and memory, but being sick, and knowing the uncertainty of life, do make ordain and establish this my last will, and revoking any and all others that may have been made by me heretofore.

Item 1st: I desire that my Executor hereinafter named, shall in case of my death, take charge of my estate, and settle off any debts I may owe, this will be for if any -
2nd: I desire that my farm and stock, and implements, tracts, be sold as soon as practicable.

3rd: I desire that my house in Irvington remain unsold and kept rented, unless my Executor think best to sell.
4th: I desire that what things I may have, outside of real estate, and money, stock &c be retained for the use and benefit of my children equally.

5th: I desire that my Executor shall use any money, or interest thereon for the education of my children, if needed while in his hands.

6th: I desire that when my executor shall have settled up my estate, that he settle it equally among my children, and the amount going to each child, he can pay to their guardian, and I would recommend that the children with the advice of my Executor choose their own guardian.
