I, Angus G. Whitfield, of Hardinsburg, Breckinridge County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all others wills heretofore made by me.

FIRST: I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as is possible.

SECOND: I hereby bequeath to my beloved wife, Cornelia Whitfield, during her natural life, with full power to sell and deliver personal property, and make deed to real estate for funds necessary for her maintenance, if the income from my estate fails to provide for her maintenance.
