

I, Ann Lacy, of Breckinridge County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and being desirous of making a different disposition of my property from that which would be made by law, should I die intestate do make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others I may have heretofore made.

1. I will and devise to my beloved nieces Maggie Wheatley and Nora Sheeran, equally, in fee simple, the one-third undivided interest in a certain tract of land, lying in Breckinridge County, Kentucky, on the waters of Tuell's creek, containing 200 acres, more or less, which interest was inherited by me from my father Timothy Lacy. For description of said land see deed book 0 at page 435 in the Clerk's office of the Breckinridge County Court.

It is my will that all the rest, residue and remainder of my property of whatever kind or character, shall be used by my executor hereinafter named, in paying costs of probating will &c burial expenses and in erecting a suitable monument to my memory.

3. I hereby nominate and appoint James L. Wheatley, executor of this will, and request that he be permitted to qualify as such without being required to give security upon his bond and such executor.
