5. I also give devise and bequeath to her one third part of all my personal estate, consisting of all my money, notes, evidences of debt, choses in action, and every and all articles of personal property. I also wish her to retain such of my household effects as she may desire.

6. The residue and remainder of my estate of all and every kind whatsoever, I wish to go to my half sisters Sarah Parker, Mary McFarland, and the two children of my deceased half sister Maria Smith, Winston Lowry Smith and Anna M. Perkins Mrs. Parker to take one share, Mrs. McFarland one share, and the two children of Maria Smith one share.

7. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Dr. William Miller, my Executor and request him to qualify as such and carry out the provisions of this will.

Know All Men by These Presents:

That I, Belle W. Boyd, of the City of Cloverport, in the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, considering the uncertainty of life and being of sound mind and in possession of all my mental faculties, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament.

First: I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved children, all of my estate, of which I shall die possessed, consisting chiefly of my Home or Residence property situated in Cloverport, Kentucky.
