

I, Benjamin F. Hinton, of Artesia, Breckinridge County, Kentucky, being of full age and of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

I. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as possible after the time of my decease.

II. All the property, real and personal, of every kind and description, wheresoever situated, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my deceased, I give, bequeath and devise to my wife and children, absolutely and in fee simple, as follows:-

III. It is my desire and purpose that my property, aforesaid, be disposed of and distributed according to the laws of descent and distribution of the State of Kentucky, at the time of my death.

IV. I make, nominate and appoint The Bank of Hardinsburg & Trust Company, of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, to be the executor of this, my last will and testament, and it is my purpose in making this will and testament to designate the said institution as my executor to be assured that my property is disposed of as the law in force directs.
