

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF C.B. MILLER.

I, C. B. Miller, now located at Eddyville, Lyon County, Kentucky, my home being in Breckinridge County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and conscious of the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do make and publish my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills, FIRST: I will that all my Just debts, if I owe any at my death, be paid, and also funeral and Burial expenses, SECOND: I will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Maggie Miller, all of the property real, personal, and mixed of which I may die seized and possessed, to be her absolute property to have, use, enjoy, sell and convey at her pleasure.

It is my will that there be no inventory, or appraisement of my estate.

I Nominate and appoint my said wife my executrix to carry into effect the provisions of this will and request that the County Judge of Breckinridge County, where my real estate is situated, permit her to qualify without giving Bond.
