

I, Chas Blanford, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and being desirous of making a different disposition of my property from that which would be made by law should I die intestate, do hereby make, publish, and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all others I may have made heretofore:

FIRST: It is my will that all my just debts shall be paid by my executors hereinafter named out of the personal property of my estate, including that portion of the Centenary pledge and the Masonic Widows and Orphans Home pledge as they fall due.

SECOND: I direct that my executors shall cause to be placed at the head of my grave a modest stone.

THIRD I hereby will and bequeath to my son, G Overton Blanford, one-half interest in all my hogs.

FOURTH After selling aside two (2) of the best cows in my herd of dairy cattle for my wife, Rose Blanford, the remainder of my herd shall be sold at public auction to the highest and best bidder and the proceeds paid to my wife.

FIFTH I desire all lambs ready or near ready for the butcher be sold and one-fourth interest be paid to my son, G. Overton Blanford, the remainder to my wife.

SIXTH I hereby will and bequeath a one-fourth interest in my sheep to my son G. Overton Blanford.

SEVENTH: I further direct that my executors hereinafter named deduct from the amount due my son G. Overton Blanford Ninety two (\$92.50) and 50/100 dollars the same being balance due from the sale of the Colored Orphans Home mules, the amount to be paid out of the above sales.

EIGHTH I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Rose E. Blanford, all the rest, residue and remainder of my property of whatever kind, character or description, wherever situated to be hers absolutely and in fee simple.

Ninth I hereby nominate and appoint my wife, Rose E. Blanford and my Son-in-law, Roy J Cain, as Executors of this will and testament, requesting them to consult my friend Walter J. Piggott, as to the disposition of the same and that they be permitted to qualify as such Executors without Bond.
