I, Charles M. Heston, being of sound mine and memory do hereby publish and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking any and all former will by me made.

FIRST. I desire that all my just debts be paid.

SECOND: I will and devise all of my property, real mixed and personal to my beloved wife Lucy Heston and daughter Clara Heston to be used and enjoyed by them ~~co~~intly during the natural life of my said wife, Lucy Heston, at the death of my said wife the remainder, if any, to pass to my said daughter Clara Heston in fee simple.

THIRD: I appoint my wife Lucy Heston, Executrix of this my will and request that she be permitted to Qualify without surety on her bond.
